Real or Fake: Which Christmas Tree is Better?*



Short answer-real!

First off, real trees don't

require the intensive carbon emissions that it takes to produce and ship artificial trees. Nearly 90% of artificial trees are shipped across the world from China, resulting in an increase of carbon emissions and resources. And most artificial trees are not recyclable and end up in local landfills.

Next, you're supporting forests and healthy soils. Out of the 350-500 million growing on tree farms across the U.S., only 30 million trees are harvested for the holidays each year. Buying real trees will help keep tree farms in business—and in turn keep their lands covered in the healthy forest habitat that supports wildlife. Once all the festivities are done, real trees can be recycled and given a second life as compost.

Try an Alternative Christmas Tree

Skip the cut or fake plastic tree this year. Choose a Trash-Free alternative instead!

Rent or adopt a tree that is delivered alive and then replanted once you are finished. Search the internet for local sources.

Decorate a plant or tree you already have, or purchase a potted tree that you can use each year or plant after the holidays.

Get creative! Make a tree out of books, a photo collage, or wooden frames, the possibilities are endless.

Manage & Dispose of "FOG" Properly

Improper disposal of Fats, Oils, and Grease (FOG) will pollute the environment and clog your pipes and sewer/septic systems.

For small amounts of FOG, scrape out or wipe



and place in your handy kitchen pail or your Organics cart.

For large amounts of FOG, use the curbside cooking oil



collection program! Residents may place used cooking oil (in sealed 1-gallon containers provided by ACI of San Ramon or the original sealed container) at the curb for collection each week. Contact us to request containers.

For even **LARGER** amounts of FOG (5-gallons or less) such as



from a turkey deep fryer, contact ACI of San Ramon to arrange collection.
